

Clinical Trial Updates

The Daiichi Sankyo clinical study "An Evaluation of Pseudoxanthoma Elasticum (PXE) Natural History Biomarkers in PXE Individuals and Their Biological Non-PXE Siblings" is fully enrolled and is nearing its completion. Those who participated have contributed to a fuller understanding of what biomarkers (measures) might work to tell if a drug is doing its job in slowing down or stopping PXE. Stay tuned for results in several months.

The pharmaceutical company Inozyme has a clinical trial for individuals who have a condition called generalized arterial calcification of infancy (GACI), which affects children due to mutations in a gene called *ENPP1*. The trial is also open to individuals who have two disease-causing mutations in *ABCC6* (PXE). One person has received the drug, INZ-701, which is designed to help restore PPi levels in the body. The purpose of this early trial is to assess the safety of different dosages of the trial drug which will help determine possible dosages to investigate in subsequent clinical trials for effectiveness. <u>Contact us</u> if you are interested in participating.
